MINUTES

CALL TO ORDER

 - 1. Special Recognition – Riley Robell, Bishop McDevitt High School State Champion Wrestler

Mr. Pries called forward Riley Robell. Riley is joined by his father, Frank, and his brother, Griffon. Riley is a Junior and is a dedicated scholar athlete. The Board hopes to see him back here next year. He told Riley to not forget his number one fans – his family. They are always there for you.

Mr. Saylor stated that when you look up domination in the dictionary, it should have a picture of Riley. The Board is honored to salute your achievement. Mr. Saylor asked him to speak about his nerves and how he overcame it.

Riley stated that his first State final in 10th grade was a blur. He knew he had to focus and began doing breathing exercises. Your leadership and dedication will follow you through life.

Mr. Pries stated that your future is very bright. Your Dad taught you well.

Mr. Hartwick was very excited to recognize Riley. He knew Riley from when he was at Holy Name Jets. He watched Riley grow up. Riley constantly makes new strides and has the ability to adopt to different styles. Riley was never scored on during his postseason run. Riley has received offers from division 1 schools for football. He asked Riley to explain how wrestling has made a difference for him when he plays football.

Riley stated you watch how someone moves and wrestling teaches you there is always a way to move where you can catch them off guard. In football you are up against some players that weigh 300/350 pounds.

Mr. Hartwick noted some of Riley's accomplishments. He was the 285-pound gold medalist, 2A class champion. He had a 5-0 win. As a lineman, Riley led McDevitt to the PIAA 4A state title game last season. He passed the 100-career victory mark this season.

Mr. Hartwick read the following Proclamation:

We, the Dauphin County Board of Commissioners, are pleased and proud to join with the many athletes, coaches, proud parents, and fans in honoring Bishop McDevitt High School junior Riley Robell for his outstanding achievement in winning the PIAA Class 2A State Wrestling Championship to cap a historic 2022 season;

Whereas, Riley avenged a runner-up finish at the 2021 state tournament by defeating Muncy's Austin Johnson, 5-0, to secure the 285-pound gold medal and complete a playoff run in which he did not allow a point to an opponent;

Whereas, Riley is a fierce competitor on the mat and athletic fields, but is also very grounded and respectful of his family, teammates, and coaches and grateful for the roles they played in him becoming an all-state athlete;

Whereas, a gifted student athlete, Riley also excelled for the Crusaders football team, anchoring the defensive line, earning All-State Team honors and garnering pursuit from numerous college recruiters;

Whereas, we credit Riley's family for supporting throughout his development and historic career and the Bishop McDevitt coaching staff, who taught Riley skills and temperament, carrying on the school's rich tradition of superb athletic programs and star wrestlers;

Therefore, we join the 286,000 residents of Dauphin County in congratulating Riley Robell on his well-deserved PIAA Class 2A Wrestling Championship; we applaud his spirit, perseverance, and determination to achieve greatness; and in grateful recognition thereof, we do hereby proudly proclaim May 11, 2022, as "Riley Robell Day" in Dauphin County.
