# 1. Presentation of Check for Disaster Planning

Rick Libra presented, on behalf of Exelon Nuclear, a check in the amount of \$110,000 to the Commissioners to be used for disaster planning. Exelon appreciates and supports the emergency planning in this area. Those living in Dauphin County reap the benefits of good disaster planning. Exelon is pleased to partner with Dauphin County and to present this check.

Steve Libhart indicated that this is a gesture that will directly benefit the citizens by providing equipment, etc. to EMA or local municipalities. A list of suggestions will be forwarded to the Commissioners on how to spend this money. Exelon has been an excellent partner. They assist with our Radiological Specialist, Bob Stout, who is with us today. We are very fortunate to have Bob with us.

Mr. Pries indicated that partnership seems to be the key word. Exelon is a good partner and the County appreciates these funds which will be used to assist in disaster planning. We know how important it is after dealing with the flood in September.

### B. Keystone Collections Group

### 1. Presentation on EIT Collection

Mr. Memmi reported on the EIT Collection process. The first meeting occurred approximately two years ago. There have been some challenges. The Committee worked very hard. Keystone stepped in and it has been a good relationship. It is a similar situation with our banking institution, Huntington Bank.

Mr. Lazzaro from Keystone Collections Group indicated that Act 32 became law and was implemented January 1<sup>st</sup> of this year. They are pleased to partner with Dauphin County to make this a very successful process. Dauphin County has been one of the most involved parties in making sure the process is user friendly. Employers in Dauphin County can pay their taxes online. This will speed up the process of getting the revenue to the local school districts and government entities. Employee training seminars have been scheduled for summer and fall. Keystone has the room to add a component for care. Tax collection is not the most popular thing and we want to invest in customer service. Every taxpayer who calls or comes in deserves to have respect and sensitivity. Taking the time to care makes a difference. There is an open house today at 1:00 p.m. Keystone looks forward to working together with Dauphin County.

#### **COMMISSIONERS' DISCUSSIONS & ACTIONS**

Mr. Hartwick reported on the Governor's proposed budget with the reductions in the categorical agencies. The State made commitments to counties to maintain the folks from the State Hospital, but this proposed budget does not address those issues. Under this proposed budget, the Mental Health budget is being reduced by \$5.3 million.

The system already is hard-pressed. Some of the programs have 10-month waiting lists. The State is proposing to bundle state human services funding into block grants to give counties more flexibility. The flexibility is something that the County asked for, but not the reduction of 20%. It appears that this is really an attempt to decimate the entire mental health system in the County. The Federal and State governments continue to push everything down to the county level. Research is being done to determine what services the counties will be required to provide.

Commissioners Haste and Hartwick indicated that the Governor's proposed budget which would leave the County with about \$18 million in annual state mental health services funding could stymie treatment efforts aimed at preventing those clients from committing crimes. People could be turned out on the street. The private sector and charities can't fill the gap, because there's only so much they can do.

The Board of Commissioners will have some difficult decisions to make should this budget be approved.
