**A RESOLUTION ACTIVATING THE PROVISIONS  
OF ORDINANCE NO. 1-2002 ENACTING A BAN ON OPEN  
BURNING IN DAUPHIN COUNTY**

**RESOLUTION NO. 14-2005**

WHEREAS, on April 14<sup>th</sup>, Dauphin County Emergency Management Director Robert P. Wentzel pursuant to the Emergency Management Services Code, 35 Pa. C.S.A App. §7501(e), recommended declaration of a Ban on Open Burning in Dauphin County; and

WHEREAS, conditions supporting this declaration include 2 (two) (+) weeks of no rain, very dry surface vegetation, unseasonably warm temperatures in the 70's and mid-80's, low relative humidity and increasing wind conditions; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Dauphin recognizing the April 14<sup>th</sup> request, desires to recognize the conditions existing in Dauphin County and activate the Ban on Open Burning provided by Ordinance No. 1 of 2002.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, it is hereby resolved by the Board of Commissioners of Dauphin County as follows:


1. Ordinance No. 1-2002 is hereby declared to be effective, and all open burning in Dauphin County, as defined in the ordinance, is banned until such time as the ban is lifted by further action of the Board of Commissioners.

2. The appropriate officials, officers, employees and agents of Dauphin County and all local and state law enforcement officers shall take such actions and do all things necessary to implement the provisions of Ordinance No. 1-2002 and to take such

emergency measures as are necessary and appropriate to alleviate the drought emergency existing in Dauphin County.
