RESOLUTION NO. 19-2006

WHEREAS, many Dauphin County employees have been called to serve in the active military as Reservist or in other military capacities on a long-term but temporary basis causing them to be absent from their employment at Dauphin County while engaged in military duties; and

WHEREAS, the Dauphin County Board of Commissioners desires that no Dauphin County employee shall have his or her pay diminished while on active duty so long as he or she remains an employee of Dauphin County; and

WHEREAS, the Dauphin County Board of Commissioners supports and intends to protect the courageous Americans who are serving in the defense of our County and her people; and

WHEREAS, these valiant defenders of freedom and their families should not be forced to make personal financial sacrifices while in the service of their Country, placing themselves in harm's way to protect and preserve our liberties.


THEREFORE, WE RESOLVE, that any full-time permanent Dauphin County employee who is involuntarily absent from duty as an employee of Dauphin County in the service of the United States military for a period in excess of fifteen (15) days shall receive the difference between the pay which he or she would make at his or her full-time position at Dauphin County and the compensation which he or she receives in his or her military capacity for so long as that individual remains an employee of Dauphin County and actively engaged in the full-time military service of the United States of America.

WE, FURTHER RESOLVE, that any full-time permanent Dauphin County employee who is voluntarily absent from duty as an employee of Dauphin County in the service of the United States military for a period in excess of fifteen (15) days, on the recommendation of his or her supervisor and the approval of the Board of Commissioners, shall receive the difference between the pay which he or she would make at his or her full-time position at Dauphin County and the compensation which he or she receives in his or her military

capacity for so long as that individual remains as employee of Dauphin County and actively engaged in the full-time military service of the United States of American.
