A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF DAUPHIN, PENNSYLVANIA,

AUTHORIZING DAUPHIN COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS TO APPLY FOR \$872,000 OF THE HOUSING AND REDEVELOPMENT ASSISTANCE GRANT PROGRAM FROM THE COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA ON BEHALF OF THE KEYSTONE DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION, INC.

Resolution of the Dauphin County Board of Commissioners authorizing the filing of a proposal for funds with the Department of Community and Economic Development (DCED), Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

WHEREAS, the Dauphin County Board of Commissioners is desirous of obtaining funds from the DCED in the amount of \$872,000 from the Housing and Redevelopment Grant Program for prevention and elimination of blight under Section 4 (c) of the Housing and Redevelopment Assistance Law, as amended.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Dauphin County Board of Commissioners that a blighting influence exists because of no renovations on the building in question and no lease tenants occupying the establishment and the proposed project will prevent further blight and or eliminate existing blight by renovating the building at 1201-1207 Mulberry Street to create "first class" office space and leasing the space to commercial occupants to provide services to the surround community.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Dauphin County Board of Commissioners will Reimburse the Commonwealth for the DCED's share of any expenditures found by DCED to be ineligible.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Commissioners of Dauphin County is directed to execute a certificate attesting to the adoption of this resolution and to furnish a copy of the Resolution to the DCED.
