**DECORUM ORDER**  
**Governing Argument on Pre-Trial Motions**

And now this 10<sup>th</sup> day of August, 2012, the following Order is entered to establish procedures, protocols and general information for those who will be present in Courtroom #1, in the Courthouse, or on Courthouse grounds during oral arguments in the above-captioned cases on Thursday, August 16, 2012.

The provisions noted as "Mandatory" shall be applied by the Court and enforced accordingly by its officers and agents. The provisions noted as "Informational" are intended to provide meaningful structure and guidance to those reporters and members of the general public who will be attending the argument.

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## MANDATORY

1. Argument is scheduled to begin at 9:00 a.m. in Courtroom #1, located on the Fifth (5<sup>th</sup>) Floor of the Dauphin County Courthouse.
2. All credentialed reporters and members of the general public attending the argument must enter the Courthouse via the Market Street entrance. Access via other Courthouse entrances will not be permitted. All credentialed reporters and members of the general public must submit to security screening both at the Market Street entrance and at the entrance to Courtroom #1.
3. The Courthouse will be open to members of the media at 7:30 a.m. Reporters with credentials will be admitted to Courtroom #1 between 8:00 a.m. and 8:30 a.m. Members of the general public will be admitted to Courtroom #1 between 8:30 a.m. and 8:50 a.m., on a first-come, first-served basis. Reporters who do not choose to be admitted specially between 8:00 a.m. and 8:30 a.m. will not lose their reserved seats, but must stand in line with the general public to gain admittance.
4. No one will be admitted to Courtroom #1 after 8:50 a.m., except as authorized by the Sheriff. All reporters and members of the general public must be seated before the proceeding begins.
5. The following applies to all attending the argument:
  - a. Those attending are expected to remain in their seats until the session has ended. Any person who leaves the courtroom during the session will not be readmitted.
  - b. Credentialed reporters will be permitted to use laptops, cell phones, smart

phones or similar devices in the courtroom solely for the purpose of note taking.

Transmission from or recording by any device is prohibited. **Such devices shall not be used during the argument for electronic based communications, and shall not be set in a mode that permits transmission of any form of communication to any person or device either in or out of the Courthouse.**

- c. Reporters and members of the general public may carry cell phones or similar devices into the courtrooms; however, any such devices must be turned off (not merely set to vibrate mode) and out of sight at all times. Transmission from or recording by those devices is prohibited.
- d. Except as provided:
  - 1. Use of the Internet or telephone service for transmitting in any way from the Courthouse is prohibited.
  - 2. No electronic transmission, video and/or sound recording, or any other electronic duplication of the proceeding is permitted in the Courthouse.
  - 3. No photography, videography or recording device of any type may be used anywhere in the Courthouse.
- e. Any person who violates the provisions of this order regarding use of electronic devices is subject to the penalties for contempt of court (including fines or summary incarceration) under any applicable statute, order, or rule of court. In addition, any reporter, and the news organization the reporter represents, will summarily lose the seat assigned to that news organization for the balance of the proceeding, and, in the discretion of the court, may also lose the privilege of

being credentialed at any subsequent trial in the cases.

- f. The foyer on the first floor of the Courthouse will be reserved for those who choose to be interviewed. Except when otherwise specifically approved by the Court, no news media interviews shall be conducted anywhere else in the Courthouse (including corridors, hallways, elevators, and interior/exterior steps).

Broadcasting from the foyer during interviews is permitted.

6. The Sheriff of Dauphin County, in consultation with the Court, shall have authority to make such reasonable rules and regulations as may be required to provide adequate security to assure the safety of all those in the Courthouse and on the Courthouse grounds and the orderly conduct of the proceeding. These regulations may include, among others:


- a. No person will be permitted to take backpacks, large purses or satchels of any kind into the courtroom, except as authorized by the Sheriff.
- b. No person will be permitted to take food or beverages into the Courthouse.
- c. No person except those authorized by the Court will be permitted beyond the bar of Courtroom #1.

## INFORMATIONAL

7. As the number of pre-registered reporters does not exceed the number allotted in Courtroom #1, and the proceeding is expected to be of limited duration, no special credentials will be issued to attendees.
8. Members of the media who have registered to attend the hearing must present photo credentials from their media outlet before entering the courtroom. If the credential does not have a photo, another form of photo ID must also be presented.
9. Only pre-registered reporters will be granted access to the foyer.
10. Parking arrangements for trucks are being coordinated by local law enforcement and the Pennsylvania Association of Broadcasters.
11. Vehicle parking is limited near the Courthouse. Reporters and members of the public who will be attending the argument should allow ample time to find parking and make their way to the Courthouse.
12. Reporters are reminded that Pennsylvania law prohibits parking within 15 feet of a fire hydrant, within 20 feet of a crosswalk at an intersection, and otherwise parking in a manner that prevents vehicles from travelling on streets. Damage caused to county and/or city property will be reported immediately to law enforcement and a police report will be filed.
13. There are limited public restrooms in the Courthouse.
